Directions:

- 1) We suggest that you print out the images of the animals, the barn, and the tack (located on the next couple of pages) on cardstock. The barn will be in scale if you enlarge it and print it out on 11 x 17 cardstock (We have an enlarged copy on our website suminskifamilybooks.com. along with the other images). Cut out each image.
- 2) Take cut out images and attach a stand made of a trimmed piece of toilet paper cardboard tube, or any item that will allow the images to stand upright.
- 3) A fun way to handle the tack (pieces of equipment for working animals, such as the saddle or the pack) is to attach velcro to both the piece of tack and the inside wall of the barn.





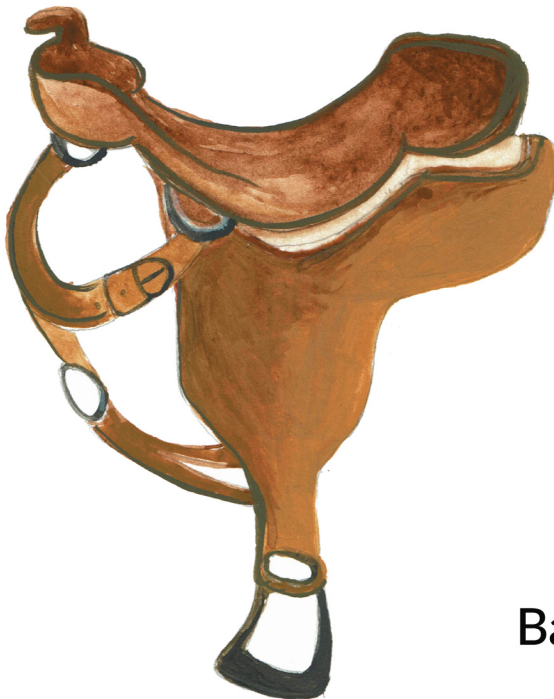
About Julia
